^{note 1} **Psychology courses carrying core Self & Society credit** (PSYC100 and PSYC230) may **not** be used to meet both Department and Core requirements.

^{note 2} **Upper division psychology elective courses** are listed in the current college catalog, along with their specific prerequisites. Students may use only one *Directed Study* psychology course (PSYC391, PSYC470, PSYC496, PSYC500) to fulfill the upper level psychology elective requirement in the major. Additional *Directed Study* courses may be used as electives toward general graduation requirements.

^{note 3} **Registration for PSYC550**, Senior Thesis, is by special arrangement with a faculty member. It requires completion of a formal thesis on a significant topic in psychology. Intended for senior psychology majors, a literature review and proposal, along with approval of two members of the
