



## **Mary K. Grant '83 Social Services Award / Spring 2019**

This is a one-time award of approximately \$2,000 paid directly to a 2018 MCLA graduate (May, August, or December) with a major in Sociology. At the time of application, the applicant must work full time in an economically disadvantaged neighborhood, preferably in Boston (South Boston, East Boston, Dorchester, Mattapan, Jamaica Plain, or Roxbury) or alternatively in Berkshire County. Employment must be within the fields of human services, social work, or community change.

Funds may be used for any purpose (including but not limited to rent, vacation, repayment of student loans, etc.) that the applicant feels will alleviate their stress and help them maintain optimism by making it more financially viable for them to continue working in one of these fields despite the low salaries typically paid.

Individuals attending graduate school on either a full or part time basis are not eligible for this award unless they are also working full time in one of the designated fields.
