Dear MCLA Student,

Earlier today, Governor Baker directed the Department of Public Health to issue a stay-at-home advisory for Massachusetts. Gov. Baker issued this advisory for temporary closure of non-essential businesses beginning tomorrow, March 24, 2020, at noon, through April 6, 2020.

Colleges and Universities are exempt from this order, but only for the purposes of facilitating distance learning or performing other essential student support functions.

Though this means MCLA offices will be on reduced staffing or will not be open to the public beginning on March 24, **this directive will not impact our move to remote instruction for the rest of the spring semester**, which is set to begin on March 30. Resident students will be allowed to come pick up their things as planned at the time you scheduled using the sign-up system in the email I sent you on March 18. If you have not arranged a time to remove your personal belongings, please contact Residential Programs and Services immediately at 413.662.5249.
