The Grants and Research team offers support to faculty throughout the academic year. We would love to hear about what you're working on in your research, in your classrooms, and in our campus community. We serve many roles and provide many resources for faculty looking to fund their work:

1. *Proposal Support:* The grants team supports faculty members in developing their projects into proposals. We provide support throughout the process from finding potential funders to editing projects to submitting and managing applications.
2. *Faculty Alerts:* If you let us know what projects you are working on or are interested in, we can set up a funding alert to notify you of potential grants opportunities.
3. *Monthly Grants Digest:* Every month, our office compiles a digest of upcoming grants from a variety of local, regional, and national funders. The digest is posted under campus announcements and is emailed to academic department chairs to be distributed to faculty.

Organization: Alexander von Humboldt Foundation

Deadline: April 1, 2021



Description: Supports a variety of fellowships for outstanding researchers in all fields to promote research collaboration with colleagues in Germany. Award winners expected to collaborate on research projects with established academics in Germany. Annual deadline: applications accepted anytime. Foundation also supports hosting German academics.

Deadline: October 12, 2021 (pre-application); January 20, 2022 (full application)

Description: DOE Office of Science hereby invites applications for support under the Early Career Research Program in the following program areas: Advanced Scientific Computing Research (ASCR); Basic Energy Sciences (BES); Biological and Environmental Research (BER); Fusion Energy Sciences (FES); High Energy Physics (HEP); Nuclear Physics (NP); Isotope R&D and Production (DOE IP); or Accelerator R&D and Production (ARDAP). The purpose of this program is to support the development of individual research programs of outstanding scientists early in their careers and to stimulate research careers in the areas supported by the Office of Science.

Deadline: 12/1/2021

Description: Supports outstanding mathematicians with a one-year fellowship of \$50,000. Applicants must have earned a Ph.D. in previous three to 12 years and must hold a tenured, tenure-track, or postdoctoral position at a U.S. college or university. Proposals must include a plan for how the fellowship will be used and must propose travel to at least one other institution.

Organization: The Library of Congress

Deadline: November 15, 2021

Description: The Library will award one grant for up to \$60,000 to a higher education institution to support the development of a digital interface, publication, exhibit, or experimental approaches to bringing digital Library of Congress material together with a course, program, or interest group that will make use of the product for educational purposes at the 2 or 4 year higher education institution. Acceptable proposals may include the development of new technologies, or the adoption of existing technologies. They may also include the integration of new materials into existing projects. They may re-use, re-mix or re-curate Library materials in new ways, in keeping with copyright and other laws.

Dumbarton Residential Fellowship

Organization: Harvard University

Deadline: November 1, 2021

Description: Dumbarton Oaks is a research institute of Harvard University, located in Washington, DC. Three types of residential fellowships relating to Byzantine Studies, Pre-Columbian Studies and Garden and Landscape Studies are available: Junior Fellowships for doctoral candidates completing their dissertations; Fellowships for established scholars who hold or will hold a doctorate by the start of the residency (stipends range from \$21,000 to \$35,000). Smaller Summer Fellowships for scholars at all levels are also available.



Research Fellowships in the Humanities

Organization: Huntington Library & Art Gallery

Deadline: November 15, 2021

Description: Supports over 150 short-term and long-term awards per year for scholars in most areas of the humanities, including British or American studies, law, art history, and the history of science, for research in residence at the Huntington Library for various lengths of time and with varied stipends. Awards up to \$50,000. Also supports Travel Grants and Exchange Fellowships for Study in Great Britain.

Newberry Fellowships

Organization: The Newberry Library

Deadline: November 1, 2021 (Long-Term); December 15, 2021 (Short-Term)

Description: Supports individual research and promotes intellectual exchange through participation in library scholarly activities, including biweekly fellows' seminar. Long-Term awards (annual deadline: 11/1) provide postdoctoral scholars \$4,200/month for four to 12 months to use library history, music, linguistics, literature, printing, and cartography collections. Short-Term awards (annual deadline: 12/15) of one to two months provide \$2,500/month to postdoctoral scholars or Ph.D. candidates with specific need for Newberry collections. Other special awards and fellowships offered.

Description: Supports exchanges between artists and arts organizations in the U.S. and Central/Eastern Europe, Russia, and Eurasia. Art Prospect Network Residency program supports U.S. arts professionals to carry out projects in eligible countries (tbd); International Fellowships U.S. and Home Country Projects (3/1/21) supports collaborative projects between organizations from U.S. and eligible countries. International Fellowships: U.S. Research Residencies (11/30/21) place artists from eligible countries at U.S. arts organizations for six weeks.
